Bromeliads trap and hold water that is used by canopy animals for drinking and reproducing. If it were not for bromeliads, canopy animals would have a hard time finding water without descending to the forest floor.

How many different kinds of fish can you find in all of Range of the Jaguar?

Lots – if students count the number of different signs their answers should range just under 20.

Why are giant otters endangered?

Over fishing threatens the otter’s food sources. Mining operations produce mercury and other toxins, poisoning the otter’s watery habitat. Motorboats pollute rivers with oil and noise. When otters compete with local fishermen for fish, they are often shot.
